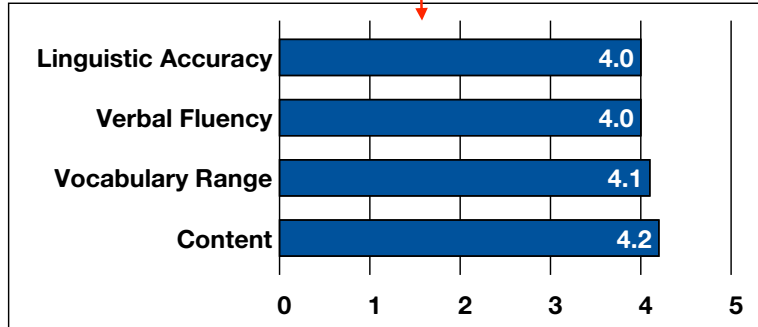

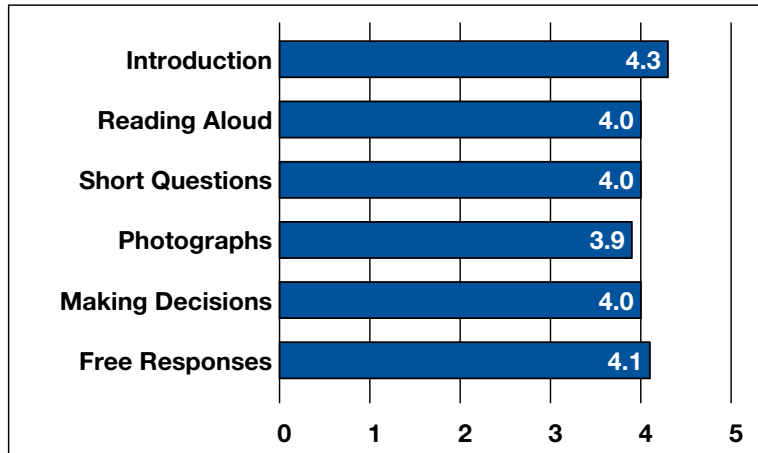

### SKILL DESCRIPTION GUIDE

SKILL	LEVEL	DESCRIPTION
Linguistic Accuracy	4.0	You have learned the rules for English sentences and can express yourself on many topics with a variety of sentence structures and verb tenses. You make occasional mistakes but they generally do not cause misunderstandings.
Verbal Fluency	4.0	Your pronunciation and intonation are mostly clear, but you make some mistakes that cause some words to be difficult to understand. Nevertheless, this doesn't impede overall understanding. You sometimes put the stress on the wrong syllable. You read the passages naturally enough, but sometimes paused unnaturally, revealing that you may not be thinking about the meaning of the passage while you are reading.
Vocabulary Range	4.1	You have a sufficient range of language to describe unpredictable situations, explain the main points in an idea or problem, and express thoughts on abstract and cultural topics. You do not always say the precise word, and sometimes you show some hesitation. Some limitations in vocabulary cause repetition.
Content	4.2	You were able to answer each question with a fairly logical, organized response. You offered examples and comparisons, although these are sometimes brief or slightly off topic. Many ideas are linked by appropriate transitions.

#### SKILLS TESTED:

LINGUISTIC ACCURACY refers to how well your sentences have the words in the correct order and correct form, and whether the meaning can be understood.

VERBAL FLUENCY refers to how well your English approaches the sound and pace of a native English speaker, and whether the sounds you produce can be understood.

VOCABULARY RANGE refers to the variety and sophistication of English words spoken, and whether you can find the precise word when necessary

CONTENT refers to how well you develop and organize your answer, and whether you can successfully answer each question.





## Linguistic Accuracy

Your English pronunciation is very good and most of what you say would be clearly understood by listeners. You do make a few pronunciation errors, and to improve your English you should make an effort to correct these errors. One effective method of practice is to imitate native speakers who speak clearly. **It is also helpful to read aloud while you are reading English so you can improve your pronunciation** as well as your comprehension at the same time. Keep up the good work!

## Verbal Fluency

Your English is quite understandable to listeners. However, you make a few mistakes in grammar, and sometimes you mix up the word order. Once you are speaking you do not want to be distracted by thinking about grammar, so the best way to avoid errors is **review grammar rules from time to time**. Keep up the good work.

## Vocabulary Range

Good job. Your vocabulary is sufficient to effectively communicate on most topics. Practice speaking in English to help remember vocabulary words more quickly. It would also help to **study the smaller words and expressions such as prepositions and idioms so you can speak express your ideas more precisely**. Keep up the good work.

## Content

Your speech was easy to understand and you stated your opinion clearly. However, some of the things you said were not clearly connected to the topic. To improve your score, carefully plan out each response while **thinking about how to link the ideas together**. When appropriate, try to offer more than one perspective on the topic in the question.
